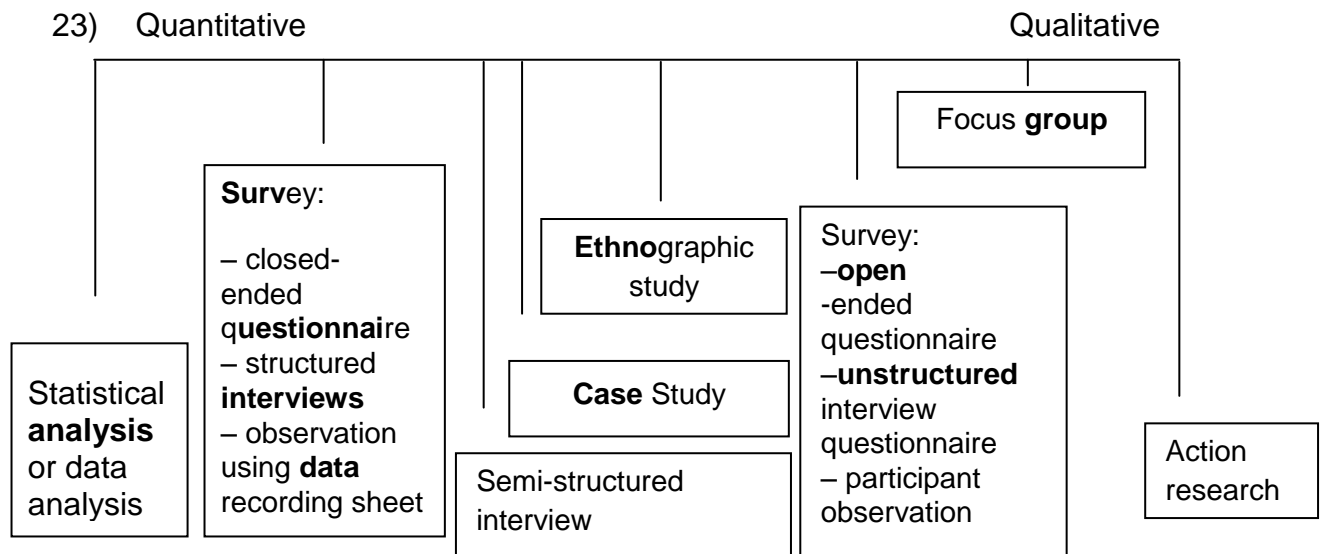

<p>Quantitative Methodologies:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • are removed from the original data • result in numerical data, tables, graphs and diagrams • use survey questionnaires and statistics as their main techniques • enable the collection of highly specific data from large populations • are easy to compare with other studies • rely heavily on the researcher's organisational skills in writing the research questions, ie at the start of the process 	<p>Qualitative Methodologies:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • are close to the original data • result in descriptive prose, quotations and summaries • use personal interviews and observations as their main techniques • enable detailed data to be obtained, but for a small population only • are difficult to compare with other studies • rely heavily on the researcher's interpretive skills to understand the complexities of the resulting data, ie at the end of the process
